Reservations, Deposits, Final Payments: Reservations will be accepted on a first come/first served basis with a deposit of \$100.00 made payable to Countryside Tours, Inc. Reservation coupon and check must be sent to Countryside Tours, Inc., P.O. Box 48, Sand Lake, Michigan 49343-0048. Final payment will be due no later than **March 31, 2012**.

Insufficient Fund Checks: There will be a \$15.00 charge for checks with insufficient funds. Tour Cost: The tour cost as advertised in this brochure is based on current costs and tariffs in effect at the time of printing. Should these change, an adjustment (either way) will result. If the advertised tour cost is increased by more than 5%, you may cancel within 10 days of notification and receive a full refund.

Cancellations and Refunds: Cancellations must be made in writing to our office. For cancellations received ten days prior to the Spring Mandatory Meeting or before, there will be a full refund less an administrative fee of \$25.00. For cancellations received after that date but prior to the Mandatory Meeting, there will be no refund of the \$100.00 deposit. No-shows for the Spring Mandatory Meeting (without permission) will be dropped from the tour and the deposit will be forfeited. Cancellations after the Spring Mandatory Meeting are as follows: Cancellations received 21 days before the trip date will receive a 50% refund; Cancellations received 14 days before the trip date will receive a 25% refund; Cancellations received seven days before the trip or no-shows will receive no refund.

Itinerary

Day 1, June 9, 2012 Saturday D

We'll depart Riley Street Middle School at 6:30 am this morning for our exciting tour to the East Coast and Washington D.C.! We'll travel towards the East Coast and our first night will be spent in Fairfield, New Jersey.

Day 2, June 10, 2012 Sunday CB L D

We will start the morning with a walk through Central Park. Then to the top of Rockefeller Center for a fantastic view of the city. After some lunch and a walk through Times Square, we will sing, dance, laugh and play at Madame Tussauds. We'll tool around town aboard a double decker bus, and then take a heart-stopping thrill ride on The Shark. After dinner at South Street Seaport we will head to Philadelphia for the night.

Day 3, June 11, 2012 Monday B L D

After breakfast at Hard Rock Cafe we will visit the Eastern State Penitentiary, where some of America's most notorious criminals were held. Then we will stop at the National Constitution Center filled with interactive displays. After lunch at the Bourse we'll see Independence Hall and the Liberty Bell before heading to Washington D.C. for the night.

Day 4, June 12, 2012 Tuesday CB L D

The morning will start with a tour of Arlington Cemetery. We will go up in the Washington Monument. After lunch we will tour the Smithsonian Museums, and visit the National Archives. Dinner will be at the Pentagon Mall with a little shopping time before heading back to our hotel for the night.

Day 5, June 13, 2012 Wednesday CB L D

We will start the day with a tour of the Capitol Building. After lunch we will have a guided tour of the memorials before heading to Gettysburg. Once in Gettysburg we will have supper and then to the Shriver House where we will learn what it was like being a civilian during the Battle of Gettysburg.

This morning will be spent touring the Gettysburg National Military Park with a Park Service guide and do some last minute souvenir shopping. This afternoon & evening we'll enjoy the amusement rides at Hershey Park! Afterwards, we will reboard our motorcoach and head for home.
