# Terms and Conditions

**Reservations, Deposits, Final Payments:** Reservations will be accepted on a first come/first served basis with a deposit of \$100.00 made payable to Countryside Tours, Inc. Reservation coupon and check must be sent to Countryside Tours, Inc., P.O. Box 48, Sand Lake, Michigan 49343-0048. Final payment will be due no later than **March 31, 2012**.

**Insufficient Fund Checks:** There will be a \$15.00 charge for checks with insufficient funds.

**Tour Cost:** The tour cost as advertised in this brochure is based on current costs and tariffs in effect at the time of printing. Should these change, an adjustment (either way) will result. If the advertised tour cost is increased by more than 5%, you may cancel within 10 days of notification and receive a full refund.

**Cancellations and Refunds:** Cancellations must be made in writing to our office. For cancellations received ten days prior to the Spring Mandatory Meeting or before, there will be a full refund less an administrative fee of \$25.00. For cancellations received after that date but prior to the Mandatory Meeting, there will be no refund of the \$100.00 deposit. No-shows for the Spring Mandatory Meeting (without permission) will be dropped from the tour and the deposit will be forfeited. Cancellations after the Spring Mandatory Meeting are as follows: Cancellations received 21 days before the trip date will receive a 50% refund; Cancellations received 14 days before the trip date will receive a 25% refund; Cancellations received seven days before the trip or no-shows will receive no refund.

### Day 1, June 12, 2012 Tuesday D

We'll depart North Rockford Middle School at 6:30 am this morning for our exciting tour to the East Coast and Washington D.C.! We'll travel through Canada so we can stop and see Niagara Falls and ride the Maid of the Mist. Our first night will be spent in Binghamton, New York.

Today will be spent exploring the "Big Apple". We will visit the Tenement Museum and learn what life was like for the immigrants back in 1916. Then on to South Street Seaport for lunch and a heart stopping thrill ride on The Shark. We'll tool around town aboard a double decker bus. Our dinner will be at the world famous Sylvia's Restaurant. Afterwards, we'll travel to Philadelphia and spend the night.

### Day 3, June 14, 2012 Thursday B L D

After breakfast at Hard Rock Cafe, we will tour Philadelphia on a horse drawn carriage. The rest of the morning will be spent touring Independence Hall, the Liberty Bell and visiting the National Constitution Center filled with interactive displays. After lunch at the Bourse we'll go to Washington D.C. for dinner at Union Station and a guided tour of our nation's capital.

### Day 4, June 15, 2012 Friday CB L D

We'll travel to Mount Vernon to tour George Washington's beautiful home and then to Arlington Cemetery for the Changing of the Guard Ceremony. We'll visit the National Archives and Ford's Theatre. Our supper will be at the Pentagon Mall, with some shopping time before we head back to our hotel.
